Program Description

Spring Initiative is a youth development nonprofit that operates long-term, holistic programs for children and families facing adverse academic, social, or economic circumstances. Our after-school and all-year cohorts provide academic, relational, and social service support to address each student's needs in a community that fosters belonging, achievement, healing, and health. Spring creates opportunities for its students to identify positive, possible, future selves by building academic and personal skills, confidence, and excitement. Spring encourages students to engage with others and themselves in a kind and proactive way. By exposing students to new places, individuals, and ideas, as well as inspiring them to invest in their own community, Spring kids feel empowered to dream big. Spring students overcome obstacles in a supportive cohort environment as they develop ambitious goals and an exciting vision for their lives. The original Springsters, who were 6th-8th graders in 2011, are now in our College & Career Spring program or in the Spring Alumni Family. Since 2014, we have added Mini Spring (3rd-4th grade), Little Spring (5th-6th grade), Junior Spring (7th-8th grade), Big Spring (9th-10th grade), and Spring 2.0 (11th-12th grade). Our next cohort to add will be Tiny Spring (1st-2nd grade).

Job Responsibilities

- Provide individual student support throughout the program time for students who can most benefit
- Transport students from school to the program, and from the program to their home in the evening
- Serve as substitute cohort direct during short-term absences and ensure smooth program operation
